Why should I join PCA

It's been around ten years since I purchased my first Porsche and it has truly been an extremely positive car experience in my life. Aside from owning and driving a first rate built sports car and me being an American muscle car owner all of my life, it has been a real social experience. Coming from the world of big block 427 Corvettes, 442's, GTO's, Chevelle SS's, Camaros, 55 and 57 Chevies, Mustangs and hopped up MOPARs (and I still love all of those shear "pin you to your seat" raw power beasts), it has been a whole new world for me. Car lovers seem to understand and appreciate other car lovers no matter what the make or model and that experience is special. But coming from the raw horsepower world to a foreign car world was indeed something foreign to me.

My first Porsche was not a light-weight. I picked a 930 Turbo; not exactly a car I would recommend for the faint of heart and definitely not one for starters. Like I said, I was an American MUSCLE car guy all my life and wanted something fast and powerful. I got that and then some: in short more than I bargained for. Despite all of their raw horsepower, my front engine, rear drive muscle cars were much easier to predict and control than this nimble rear engine, rear drive, light front ended machine. I quickly learned to respect this mini-powerhouse and despite my years on the track and my view as being a pretty good driver, came to appreciate Dirty Harry's phrase "a man has to know his limitations".

So I now was a Porsche owner...what comes next? Like many car guys, I have been in assorted car clubs all of my adult life. I start talking with other Porsche owners and they told me about their Porsche Club, the Porsche Club of America or PCA as it is known. I joined PCA after I had owned my Porsche for a couple of years and received a letter from PCA welcoming me aboard. Shortly thereafter, I received a letter from my local affiliation, the Hudson-Champlain Region Porsche Club

Now I am familiar that Porsches are rather expensive cars (this was not a car that the average person owned) and not one you saw with great regularity on the highway. With that, I connoted that owners would be an uppity, stiff, class conscious group that I would not feel comfortable with and as a result I did not jump to participate with the group. A little down the pike (I read in their on-line newsletter) about an upcoming social driving event and my wife and I decided to take advantage of the opportunity. What an eye-opener and what a revelation to my false misconception about the car and those who owned them. Yes, Porsches are great cars, but their owners turned out to be a great group of folks who many have become close friends to both me and my wife. Our Porsche club has become an extension of our social life to both of us. This is NOT just a guy's club; it is a family club. Our club is a little more unique from other chapters in that it has been taken to a higher level. While in most car clubs it is about the car, tracking or driving it, in our group it is about the car AND the car owners. For married couples, that means both the car owner AND the spouse. Even at simple get-togethers like our monthly meetings, that concept is tempered into the club meeting with a social time complimented by food and refreshments. The club does an excellent job of ensuring that member's spouses are made to feel part of the club. My wife looks forward to get-togethers as much as I do, it is not only for the social aspect, but because she has learned to enjoy the car for all the same reasons I do. It doesn't end there. I have two boys in their early twenties and the club has welcomed them with open arms. This is a great bonding environment, where members and

their children can grow closer and share their love for great cars. Throughout our events, the car part and the social parts are interwoven to create a wonderful experience. My only regret is that I waited so long to join. I think the key to enjoying your car is to make it a family affair and that begins by joining PCA.

Once you have taken the first step and you have become a club member, it is up to you to make the most of that experience. There are a host of opportunities available, for which you can take advantage of one or all.

At our monthly meetings club business is discussed along with special points of information or tech sessions that occur at each meeting to provide owners more knowledge and understanding of their cars. There are also several different levels of driving opportunities, from novice to experienced as well as for just fun, to let you share the driving experience with other club members. For folks with starter driving skills, there are basic gymkhana events. Those who have honed their skills and would like to get all they can out of their cars, there are numerous track events at some of the country's best tracks (like Watkins Glenn and Limerock to mention a couple). And then there are those monthly social driving excursions, which allow an owner to the opportunity to blend scenic driving with a highlighting visit to various hotspots. Having a pleasure vehicle has always been a way of life for me, but being able to spot what is wrong when something is wrong and being able to fix and maintain that car has made the experience so much better. This part of the club shines and makes the Porsche experience even more meaningful.

Now that I have informed you of what is in it for you by joining PCA, how do we make this dream a reality? Your first step is your Porsche purchase. Once you have done that (or if you already own a Porsche) you can go to pca.org and fill out and submit your application for membership online (you will need your VIN

as part of the application process). When you have completed the application form and made your payment, you will receive your membership ID and will soon be receiving information on the regional club. In addition, you will receive your free subscription to the monthly Porsche publication, PANORAMA. This outstanding publication has many tech articles, new and old car stories, a classified section and many more bits of information on your car or car you are pursuing. Once you receive your information package you can start your journey to many opportunities offered by the club. As a member of the Hudson and Champlain Regional PCA, you will be a part of this great Porsche family and can immediately participate with us in many fun filled activities. In addition, the Hudson-Champlain PCA has its own web page which you can visit at hpc.pca.org; there are endless topics of interest from club overviews to contacts to activities and events to classifieds to help you keep your fingers on the pulse of your club. By passing on to you what I learned, hopefully you will not wait as long as I did before starting your friendship with PCA and the Hudson Champlain Regional club This is just a glance at all of the things this outstanding organization offers to its members. 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


