The club's first two Drivers Education events of the year are at Lime Rock Park in CT. Friday, April 8th is an advanced DE for white run group drivers and up, and I am pleased to say that we have sold all 30 spots for that event. Saturday the 9th is a novice DE for the Green, Yellow and Red run group drivers. We have

sold out the Green and Yellow instructed run groups and have only 3 spots left for Yellow solo drivers. With such a tremendous turn out for both events, we have turned a tidy little profit to start off the season.

If you were not able to make it into either of these events, not to worry. Registration for our Cups and Saucers Advanced DE, on May 11th and 12th, is currently open. This is an advanced DE for white run group drivers and up. Once again, we will have pro coaching available for hire as well as a Wednesday night dinner featuring Skip Barber instructor Peter Argetsinger. Complete information on this event can be found at clubregistration.net. Once again Zone 1 will be hosting their annual 48 Hours at The Glen DE on June 17th - 19th. This event is open to all run groups, with Friday being an instructor only day. This is the longest running PCA Drivers Education event in the country. Drivers are treated to 30 minute run sessions both days and last year HCP members went out for a group dinner on Saturday night, which we plan to do again this year. Registration for this event will open on April 15th via clubregistration.net. Last year we had over 20 drivers from our region attend, and I would love to top that number this year.

The last thing I would like to discuss is elections. 2011 is an election year for our club, and even though it is only April, it is not too early to start thinking about our elections this Fall. Elections will be held for the positions of President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer. If you are interested in running for one of these positions please feel free to talk to one of the current Board Members and we will be more then happy to let you know what the job entails. Drivers Education Mentor Program

s it anyone else's first time at the track? What brake pads should I use in my 911? Is there a nice hotel in Watkins Glen? Do I know anybody going to the Connecticut Valley, Lime Rock Park, Drivers Education event? Where is a good place to eat in Mt. Tremblant? What is the best route to Monticello Motorsports Park? Who can perform the tech inspection for my car in the Albany area?

For both experienced and new drivers, many questions arise before ever setting your tires on track at a PCA Drivers Education event. Maybe you have had all of these questions in the past or maybe there are ones you forgot to ask that you wish you had. In either situation the new HCP PCA Drivers Education Mentor Program is here to help.

The new Mentor Program's goals are simple; to pair Novice attendees with Experienced attendees for all of the off-the-track information that they might need. HCP has assembled a group of its own members with significant track day experience who are willing to share their knowledge with interested Green and Yellow run group drivers. This program is separate from the Instructor program, as a mentor can be paired with someone at any time before a track event. Examples of questions we can help answer include:

- Is there any track etiquette I need to know?
- Where do I stay? Where can I find something to eat? How do I get there?
- What can I do with my family when off track?
- Who else is going? Can I caravan with someone?
- What do I need to do to prepare my car (including technical information)?
- What do I need to do to prepare myself?
- Is there someone from HCP going to another regions DE event?

Let the HCP DE mentor program help you sort the details so that you can focus on having a fun and safe time at the track! Meet Me At The Apex

ell, Spring time is finally approaching, which means track season begins! If you're like me, you've probably spent a portion of the winter dreaming about getting back on the track, watching videos, reading about new techniques and discussing with friends how to "go faster". And now it's time to see if our skills will actually improve! The corresponding question to, "Have my skills improved?" is, "Am I ready for the next run group?" In an effort to ensure drivers of similar skill levels are driving together (both

in our region and when drivers participate with other regions), I've been busy this winter with the club officers to come up with an official "driver's ed progression process", which I'll outline here. This process will not only give drivers a clear definition of the steps and expectations, but it also closely mimics the methods used by the larger regions in

the Northeast (the larger the region, the more track days it hosts, and the more opportunities we have for driving on the track). By adopting a sort of standardized protocol, we take steps to ensure our skill level divisions are the same as other regions; therefore, if you're driving in the White group with us, your skills are adequate for CVR's White group (and NNJR's, and Metro's, etc.).

The two largest factors that build high-speed driving skills are: seat time and level of instruction. As such, these become the foundation of the guidelines. The table below outlines an expected number of days in each run group — and the amount of instruction recommended (some of the instruction is mandatory and some is "suggested" — but, remember, every instructor will have different styles, nuances and experience, the more knowledge you put in the passenger seat, the better you'll be able to grow).

Green to Yellow	5	5
Yellow to White	13	5*
White to Black	12	4**
Black to Red***	10	

^{*}Of the 8 solo days, an instructor should be solicited for at least 1 session 4 of those days.

^{**}At least 1 session per day.

^{***}If a Black driver is interested, a meeting with the chief instructor is the first step to becoming an instructor candidate.

The Hemmings Motornews MGB is in the final stages of re-assembly. Of course, in addition to just racking up seat time, there are proficiency skills identified with each run group and, as an organization, we want to make sure each driver has the right skills to progress to the next level. Evaluation rides, where an instructor uses a checklist and fills out a written evaluation form, will be used to assess skill competency. For progression from the Green to Yellow group, one successful checkout ride is needed. For all other run group progressions, two successful checkout rides are required (on two different days with two different instructors). If possible, one of the two checkout rides will be performed in the next run group up – for example, to progress from White to Black, one checkout ride will be in each group. If, after a checkout ride, the instructor feels the driver is not ready for the progression, the skills that need development will be discussed and, when the driver feels they have been mastered, he/she can request another checkout ride.

To schedule a checkout ride, simply speak with (or email) the chief instructor or track chair prior to an event – it may not always be logistically possible to schedule a checkout ride if the request is made *during* the event.


